



Week Beginning: 26th November 2018

Theme: Sending Letters

Monday: During circle time this morning we will talk about the seasons and the various weather conditions. We will then work on our letter of the week which is "W". The children can then eat watermelon.

In the afternoon we will work on our 2nd letter of the week "Z". We will then work on a paint mixing activity and seeing how the colours changed.

Friday: This morning is show and tell, the children can bring in a favourite toy from home. We will then be making a post box so that we can start writing and posting our letters to Santa.

In the afternoon we will be playing a game and finding things beginning with "W". We will then be looking at the hands of the clock and seeing if we can tell the time. We will play "What's the Time Mr Wolf?" whilst using the clock
